## Candidacies for the OIQ's Board of Directors

In the general elections for the Board of Directors of the Ordre des ingénieurs du Québec, fourteen (14) members are running for office in the regions of Montreal, Quebec City, and Mauricie-Bois-Francs-Centre-du-Québec. Below are the names of each of the candidates, as well as a description of the voting procedure.


Voting procedure:

Members who are personally domiciled in regions with elections and registered on the OIQ's roll as of April 11, 2017 will be asked to vote on line between May 5 and 26, 2017.

To exercise your right to vote, you will need to follow this procedure:

1. Go to [www.electionsoiq.ca](http://www.electionsoiq.ca), where you can read all of the information submitted by the candidates in each region as well as other documents.
2. Click on the "JE VOTE" button, which will be active as soon as the poll opens at 4 p.m. on May 5, 2017.
3. You will then be asked to identify yourself with your member number and the password you use to log in to your portal. The entire voting procedure is of course anonymous.
4. You will be redirected to the external voting platform where you will gain access to your ballot.
5. You will then simply need to check the box to the left of the candidate(s) you choose and submit your ballot. Please note that it is entirely possible to submit a blank vote by submitting your ballot without choosing any candidates.

Please also note that once you submit your ballot, your vote will be recorded and you will no longer have access to the voting platform.
